

## CEIAG and Destination Summary : September 2016

### Post 18 Destinations :

Students receive CEIAG throughout the 2 years. Delivery includes :

Assemblies, outside speakers, HE Conference in April, Apprenticeship and entrepreneur events, UCAS presentations by Bath University, Bath On Track Programme and workshops on CV writing and Interview skills. Career based information is regularly emailed to students and placed on the website, eg local Apprenticeship vacancies.

Yr 12 students are offered a mock interview and have the opportunity for a work placement.

**2016** : The % applying for Higher Education has remained similar to last year at approximately 70% from Yr 13 and 14. The most common choices remain Plymouth, Bournemouth, Cardiff, Swansea and Southampton, although this year, Universities such as Keele, Exeter, Liverpool and Loughborough have been more common. In 2016, 3 students submitted an Oxbridge application. Students taking a non-university career route have secured Level 3 apprenticeships, continued in education within Further Education or secured local employment.

### Post 16 Destinations :

CEIAG is delivered throughout the curriculum with specific guidance for post 16 choices in Yr 10 through Assemblies, a Careers` week with mock interviews, work experience, CV writing and aspirational activities. This support continues in Yr 11 with Assemblies, the 6th Open Evening and a rigorous system of tracking applications. All students in Years 9 to 11 have access to independent careers advice and more vulnerable students are given additional support and their IAG pathway is recorded, tracked and rag rated. A lead professional is allocated to monitor. The school website and email is used regularly to give access to IAG.

### 2016 :

The % of cohort joining the 6<sup>th</sup> Form remains consistent with GCSE % A\*- C. In September 2016 the Rugby Academy (new) and the CACHE course have attracted additional students. The most common alternatives to Sixth form include Trowbridge College and Bath College. Students who may fail to secure a placement (potential NEETS) are identified early and support given within the Academy, together with support from outside agencies. The September Guarantee confirms which places which have been taken up by students and this is available in October.
